- 3. Should a participant withdraw, no refunds will be given.
- 4. Name and surnames of participants must be neatly filled in on form for certificate purposes.
- 5. Age is determined on 1 September 2023.
- 6. Same pieces may not be played in different categories.
- 7. The **Prize Winners Concert** is on 17 September at Westerford High School in the afternoon. Time to be confirmed.

### **ADJUDICATION**

- 1. All sections will take place from the 11<sup>th</sup> to 16<sup>th</sup> September 2023 at Westerford High School auditorium. (Weekday adjudication will be in the afternoons from 3h30pm until 8pm, and Saturday from 10am until 8pm). **TIME AND SCHEDULE IS LIMITED TO THESE DATES** so there is a limit to number of entries.
- 2. The adjudicator's decision is final.
- 3. No communication with the adjudicator during the Eisteddfod is allowed.
- 4. No recording of the adjudicator's feedback is allowed.
- 5. A clear copy of the music must be brought for the adjudicator.
- 6. The competition does not condone performances from copied sheet music.

#### **PRIZES & AWARD CATEGORIES**

1. Certificates will be presented to participants as follows:

Grand Prize At least 95% and only to the participant with the highest

mark in category, even if more than one receives above 95%

First Prize/ Cum Laude 90% and above

Second Prize/Gold Plus 86-89%

Third Prize/Gold 80-85%

Silver Plus 76-79%

Silver 70-75%

2. Money prizes will be given for best pianist and runner up in most age categories and for the best performance of a J. S. Bach and Sonata/Sonatina work. These prizes will be awarded at the Prize-Winners Concert with a certificate.

- 3. Participants are only eligible for prizes if they have achieved at least two First Prize/Cum Laude awards. The prize winners are selected by the adjudicator in consultation with the organizer and based on the aggregate of the highest awarded marks during the competition.
- 4. Prizes do not have to be awarded if the standard is not high enough.
- 5. No correspondence regarding prizes and prize winners will be allowed.

One work from any style period or piano teaching method book

Age categories: 6 years/7 years/8 years

Maximum duration: 3 minutes

# **Older Beginner**

Any piece from the piano teaching method books or easy piece up to grade 1 level

Age category: 9 to 19 yearsMaximum duration: 3 minutes

## **Baroque**

• Any work from the Baroque period (1600- 1750)

Age categories: 10 years and under/11 to 13 years/14 to 16 years/17 to 19 years

Maximum duration:

o 10 years and under – 5 minutes

o 11 to 13 years – 10 minutes

○ 14 to 16 years – 10 minutes

o 17 to 19 years – 10 minutes



# Classical

- Any work from the Classical Period (1750-1820)
- Any movement from a Classical Sonata may be played
- Age categories: 10 years and under/11 to 13 years/14 to 16 years/17 to 19 years
- Maximum duration:
  - 10 years and under 5 minutes
  - o 11 to 13 years 10 minutes
  - 14 to 16 years 10 minutes
  - 17 to 19 years 10 minutes

#### Romantic

- Any work from the Romantic Period (1820-1900)
- Age categories: 10 years and under/11 to 13 years/14 to 16 years/17 to 19 years
- Maximum duration:
  - 10 and under 5 minutes
  - o 11 to 13 years 10 minutes
  - o 14 to 16 years 10 minutes
  - o 17 to 19 years 10 minutes

## Impressionism/Modern

- Any work from the Impressionism and Modern Period (post 1900)
- Age categories: 10 years and under/11 to 13 years/14 to 16 years/17 to 19 years
- Maximum duration:
  - 10 years and under 5 minutes
  - o 11 to 13 years 10 minutes
  - o 14 to 16 years 10 minutes
  - o 17 to 19 years 10 minutes

## Sonata/Sonatina

- First or Third movement of a Sonata or Sonatina. Scarlatti Sonatas excluded
- Age categories: 10 years and under/11 to 13 years/14 to 16 years/17 to 19 years
- Maximum duration:
  - o 10 years and under 5 minutes
  - o 11 to 13 years 10 minutes
  - 14 to 16 years 10 minutes
  - o 17 to 19 years 10 minutes

# JS Bach

- Any work by JS Bach
- Age categories: 10 years and under/11 to 13 years/14 to 16 years/17 to 19 years
- Maximum duration:
  - o 10 years and under 5 minutes
  - o 11 to 13 years 10 minutes



- 14 to 16 years 10 minutes
- 17 to 19 years 10 minutes

### **Duets & Trios**

- Any piece from any style (Art music/Jazz/Popular)
- Age categories: Junior (13 years and under) & Senior (14 years and over)
- Maximum duration:
  - o Junior 5 minutes
  - o Senior 10 minutes
